OMNISCIENT POINT OF VIEW

In a story told from the **third-person omniscient point of view**, the narrator is all-knowing. This kind of narrator can provide the reader with insights into the thoughts, motivations, and responses of more than one character. This information will affect how you feel about the characters. Some of the information the narrator shares is factual. In other passages, the narrator might present opinions with which you can agree or disagree.
